Department Overview

Primary functions of WSR-PCH Global Regulatory Strategy include management of global projects; provision of regulatory advice & support to project teams on the requirements of the EMEA region (Europe, Middle East & Africa plus Russia); and monitoring/communication/management of changes in the regulatory environment to key stakeholders. These functions ensure Pfizer meets regulatory requirements in defined target markets for non-prescription medicines, medical devices, dietary supplements and cosmetic products from development to commercialization and throughout their lifecycle.

What can I achieve and what will I be responsible for whilst completing a placement at Pfizer?

It is the responsibility of the Undergraduate Regulatory Strategist to aid the development and implementation of innovative regulatory strategies for non-prescription (“over-the-counter”) medicinal products (Anadin/Advil), medical devices (Thermacare), dietary supplements (Centrum/EmergenC) and cosmetic products (Chapstick/Preparation H Wipes) as well as coordinate the efforts to maintain Pfizer products to the highest standards of safety, efficacy and compliance.

During the year, an Undergraduate has responsibility for:

- Day to day provision of support in the compilation of general regulatory project documents, product labelling, new/lifecycle applications to regulatory authorities;
- Responding to questions received from regulatory authorities;
- Supporting multiple projects;
- Providing advice and information to the in country regulatory teams across EMEA; and
- Monitoring, communicating and managing changes in the regulatory environment.

This position is based in a dynamic regulatory strategy group supporting the consumer health business unit. Consumer Healthcare projects can be fast-paced and the regulatory strategists need to be flexible and well-organised.

What other opportunities and benefits do Pfizer offer?

- A year's experience working in consumer regulatory affairs and an understanding of how this supports and interfaces with the key stakeholders such as country affiliates, project managers, research & development, commercial, medical and global supply functions.
